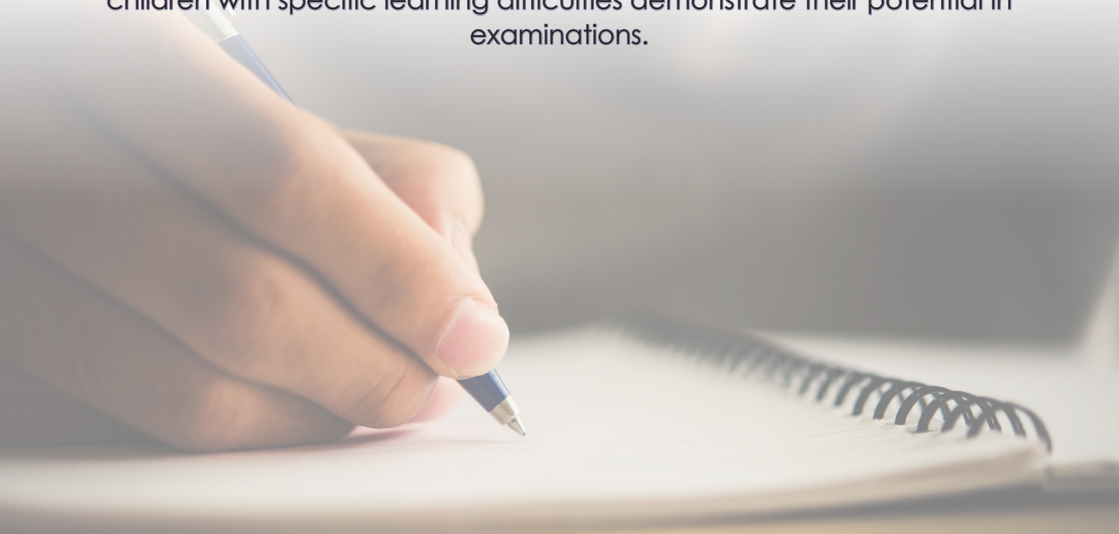


READERS AND SCRIBES
